Welcome to the Eu-SPRI Annual Conference 2025!

The Social Research Center of TU Dortmund University's Department of Social Sciences is pleased to host this year's Eu-SPRI Annual Conference taking place in Dortmund from 11 to 13 June. 77 thematic sessions and 250 individual contributions reflect the conference theme "Shaping societal futures with STI Policies" from various angles.

The conference is the latest edition of a series of annual conferences that began with an event organised by the University of Twente in 2010. Against the backdrop of major societal challenges, the topics and focus of STI policies have also evolved. In recent years, the question of the contribution of STI policies to overcoming the major societal challenges and supporting the necessary transformation processes has become the focus of attention. With deepening social, ecological and economic crises, the question of the extent to which STI policy is able to respond to rapidly changing and often unpredictable developments and to strengthen the resilience and the innovative capacity of our societies is becoming more and more important.

Against this background, the question which contributions STI policy can make in order to ensure prosperity in an effective and sustainable way and to (co-)create a just and resilient society in which nature and the environment, the economy and people's needs are in harmony, is voiced increasingly. It becomes clear that in view of far-reaching social, ecological, technological and geopolitical changes, social, digital and green transitions must be systematically interlinked.

This raises the question of how the innovation potential of the entire society can be reaped to increase the impact of STI policies and, more generally, what kind of innovation concept is needed to facilitate the achievement of the diverse and sometimes contradictory goals under the conditions of increasingly crisis-ridden processes.

This conference is also an opportunity to present multiple aspects of Science, Technology and Innovation research at TU Dortmund University. For many years, the work of the Social Research Centre has focused on work-related innovation research and social innovation research. Furthermore, the Department of Social Sciences, the Department of Business and Economics, the Centre for Higher Education and the Center for Entrepreneurship and Transfer have contributed to the conference's research area from different research angles.

The thematic focus of the conference is also reflected in the work of organisations supporting the conference. The European School of Social Innovation was formed to assist and enhance a holistic concept of innovation with a focus on the contribution of innovations to cope with the great societal challenges. The DASA is Germany's largest exhibition on the world of work and an inspiring venue for the conference dinner. This exhibition also reflects the exciting history of the perpetual transformation processes in the Ruhr Area and also the successful work of the City of Dortmund, as first German city to be honoured with the iCapital Award as 'European Capital of Innovation' by the European Commission.

Keynote Speech (Day 1)

New Role of State for (Transformative) Innovation

Prof. Uwe Cantner

Chair of Economics/Microeconomics,
Friedrich Schiller University Jena

Chair of the Commission of Experts for

Prof. Uwe Cantner has been a member of the Commission of Experts for Research and Innovation since December 2015. He became chair of the Commission in May 2019.

He holds the chair of Economics/Microeconomics at the Friedrich Schiller University Jena. Furthermore, he is Professor of Economics at the University of Southern Denmark, Odense, Denmark. Uwe Cantner taught as visiting professor at the Collegio Carlo Albert in Turin, Italy, as well as at various universities in France.

He was and is head of several committees such as the Joseph A. Schumpeter Society, which he headed in 2013/2014 and is now its Secretary General. From 2005 to 2011, he was deputy head of the Governing Boards of the DIME EU Network of Excellence (Dynamics of Institutions and Markets in Europe). He was chairman of the scientific advisory board of the Halle Institute of Economic Research (IWH) from 2012 to 2016.

Uwe Cantner is member of the scientific commission of the Mannheim Innovation Panel at the Centre for European Economic Research (ZEW), Director of the Jena Graduate School “Human Behaviour in Social and Economic Change”, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the “Schumpeter Centre for the Study of Social and Economic Change”.

Uwe Cantner is editor of the Journal of Evolutionary Economics and co-editor of numerous other publications. To date, he has published six books and more than hundred scientific essays in international journals.

He studied at the universities of Augsburg and Detroit, earned his doctorate at the Ludwig Maximilians University Munich and qualified as a professor at the University of Augsburg.

His research focuses on innovation economics in the fields of entrepreneurship and start-ups, clusters, networks and transfers, industrial dynamics, radical and transformative change, science and higher education, indicators, and research and innovation policy.

Keynote Speech (Day 2)

The role of citizen participation and inclusion in STI Policies

Dr. Caroline Paunov

Head of Secretariat for the OECD Working Party on Innovation and Technology Policy (TIP), OECD Directorate for Science, Technology and Innovation



Caroline Paunov serves as the Head of Secretariat for the OECD Working Party on Innovation and Technology Policy (TIP) within the OECD Directorate for Science, Technology and Innovation. In this capacity, she acts as policy advisor and oversees the collaborative activities of more than 100 country policy delegates and experts.

Caroline's current focus spans three key areas. She leads TIP policy research on frontier technology ecosystem initiatives, including those promoting sustainability, and how they can best support growth and diffusion. She also steers the TIP's work on distributional challenges of technological progress in digital and environmental transitions. A cross-cutting theme of her research regards enhancing policy agility. As part of these efforts, she leads a comprehensive OECD assessment commissioned by the UK government, to develop policy recommendations to optimise.

Caroline has an extensive track record in innovation and technology policy, with over 70 publications, in addition to widely cited academic papers published in leading journals. She also has extensive convening experience, with over 100 international events on record. Her academic journey encompasses a B.A. and M.A. (Hons) from the University of Oxford, an M.Sc. from the University Pompeu Fabra, and a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of London.

Dr. Filipe Almeida

Filipe Almeida is the president of Portugal Social Innovation, a pioneering Government initiative that mobilizes European funds to promote social innovation and social entrepreneurship, as well as develop the social investment market in Portugal.

He is also professor of the University of Coimbra and researcher at the Center of Social Studies (CES/FEUC) and Center of Cooperative and Social Economy Studies (CECES/FEUC).

He holds a PhD in Business Administration from EBAPE / FGV (Brazilian School of Public Administration and Business, Getúlio Vargas Foundation, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil) and a PhD in Business Management from the University of Coimbra. He is the author of several books and articles in Business Ethics, Corporate Social Responsibility and Academic Fraud.



Prof. Alejandra Boni

Professor, Universitat Politècnica de València (Spain)

Alejandra Boni is a full professor at Universitat Politècnica de València (Spain) and a research fellow at Ingenio (CSIC-UPV). She is an extraordinary professor at the University of the Free State in South Africa.

Her research interests focus on transformative innovation, transitions, human development and learning in different fields, such as policy processes, higher education and grassroots initiatives. She is the co-director of the Transformative Innovation Policy Consortium (TIPC) and the editor-in-chief of the Journal of Human Development and Capabilities.

She was involved in research projects, training and policy advice in different European countries, Colombia, Mexico, Peru, South Africa and Nigeria.



Louise Pulford

CEO, SIX – Social Innovation Exchange,
London

Louise Pulford, CEO, SIX - Louise had led SIX for over a decade, and now leads a global team based in London, Spain and Saudi Arabia. Under her leadership, SIX has hosted hundreds of events across 6 continents in over 30 cities. SIX has developed from being the world's primary social innovation network to now running major programmes to help philanthropy, companies and governments embrace social innovation and prepare for future challenges more effectively.

Louise has worked on social innovation with the European Commission since 2010, and advises several European projects. Louise also sat on the Advisory group for social innovation for the Seoul Metropolitan Government, and worked with the Mayor of Seoul to embed social innovation and community engagement into the city agendas.

Louise is a seasoned speaker on cross sector/border collaboration, bridge building, future thinking and social innovation globally. She regularly runs social innovation training programmes for governments, foundations and universities around the world. Louise also publishes regular articles on networks and social innovation.

Dr. Klaus Schuch

Dr. Klaus Schuch is scientific director and senior scientist at the Centre for Social Innovation (ZSI), Austria, the longest established research centre on social innovation in the EU. ZSI's research focusses on the social embedding and impact of all types of innovations and contributes to the design and diffusion of socially accepted and sustainable innovations to meet global challenges.

Klaus is expert on (societal) impact of research and innovation, international R&I cooperation, R&I policies, and evaluation. From May 2012 to October 2023, Klaus was also managing director of the Austrian Platform for Research and Technology Policy Evaluation. Klaus gained insights on social innovation from his evaluative work, especially in the field of development cooperation. He was lecturing many years at the Department of Development Studies at the University of Vienna. Klaus is also member of the board of the European School of Social Innovation.

The Future of the European R&I Framework Programme FP 10

Prof. Carsten Dreher

Professor for Innovation Management at Freie
Universität Berlin



Since 2009, Carsten Dreher, is at Freie Universität Berlin. He studied Industrial Engineering and Occupational Training at the Technical University of Karlsruhe, now Karlsruhe Institute of Technology. He started his career at the European Commission's Directorate General Research as junior research fellow at the unit Forecasting and Assessment in Science and Technology (FAST). From 1989 to 2005 he worked at the Fraunhofer Institute for System and Innovation Research (ISI) (1996 – 2005 as head of department) in Karlsruhe analysing industrial innovation behaviour. After finishing his PhD in 1996 at TU Karlsruhe and being visiting scholar at MIT's Industrial Performance Center, he was appointed 2006 Joint Professor for Innovation Research and Innovation Management at the University of Flensburg and at the Mads Claussen Institute for Product Innovation of the University of Southern Denmark. His research interests are analysing technology dynamics, using foresight instruments for developing longterm innovation strategies and mechanisms and impact of public research and innovation policies. He was appointed the first time to the EIC Board in November 2021.

Paula Kivimaa, PhD, is Research Professor in Climate and Society in the Finnish Environment Institute Syke, Associate at SPRU, University of Sussex, and Associate Editor in Environmental Innovation and Societal Transitions. She is an internationally renowned scholar in sustainability transitions, with over 20-year research experience on innovations, public policy, climate change, energy and mobility. Kivimaa's recent and ongoing work is oriented to how security and geopolitics tie into innovation policy and energy transitions. She recently authored a book "Security in Sustainable Energy Transitions" published by Cambridge University Press. Kivimaa has held several expert positions nationally and internationally. Currently, she is a member of the Joint Research Centre's Expert Group on Fair and Sustainable Economy and DG GROW Fellow 2025 for the European Commission, and a member of the Finnish Climate Change Panel. In 2024, Kivimaa was one of the authors of DG RTD commissioned expert report "Addressing European research and innovation challenges for system transitions in energy and mobility."

Preparatory work for FP10 is currently her main field of occupation.

PRESENTATION FORMATS

Oral sessions usually consist of a mixture of full presentations and panel discussions. Organisers are free to choose the type of exchange. We are also pleased to present posters three times: each day at lunchtime in the lobby. Grab a tasty dish and discuss with the poster presenters!

If papers are suddenly missing from a session in a new version of the programme, this means that they have been withdrawn.

Presenters, Session Chairs and Discussants are kindly asked to observe these important rules:

- Paper presentations take place in 90-minute sessions.
- Session Chairs of meetings must ensure that an equal distribution of speaking and discussion time is agreed upon between all speakers before the meeting begins. As a rule, the gross time per speaker should take up 70% and the discussion of the presentation 30% of the time. Deviations must be agreed upon.
- Time keeping: The conference agenda is very full with almost 250 registered papers. Time keeping is the responsibility of the Session Chair to ensure that presenting time and discussion time is balanced according to their judgement.
- Use of computers: Each room is equipped with a PC and a projector.
- Uploading your presentation on the day: Presenters and Chairs should arrive at the room 5 minutes at the latest before the start of their session, to ensure that presentations are uploaded to the PC. In order to upload your presentation, please bring your presentation on a memory/USB stick.

HOW TO GET TO TU DORTMUND UNIVERSITY:

The central location of the campus offers you excellent connections to public transport and the highways. The [interactive campus map](#) supports you to find your way to facilities on the campus.

By **bus and train**: the “Dortmund Universität” S-Bahn station is located directly on the North Campus. From there, the S-Bahn line S1 runs every 15 or 30 minutes to Dortmund main station and in the opposite direction to Düsseldorf main station via Bochum, Essen and Duisburg. The university can also be reached by the bus lines 445, 447 and 462. Timetable information can be found on the homepage of the [Rhine-Ruhr transport association](#), and DSW21 also offers an [interactive route network map](#).

By **car**: the campus of TU Dortmund University is located near the Dortmund West highway junction, where the A45 crosses the B1/A40 Ruhr expressway. The Dortmund-Eichlinghofen exit on the A45 leads to Campus South and North, the Dortmund-Dorstfeld exit on the A40 to Campus North. The university is signposted at both exits.

By **H-Bahn**: the [H-Bahn](#) is one of the landmarks of TU Dortmund University, being a hanging magnet train running in single cabins. Line 1 runs every 10 minutes between Dortmund Eichlinghofen and the Technology Center via Campus South and Dortmund University S, while Line 2 runs every 5 minutes between Campus North and Campus South. This route takes two minutes.

By **plane**: from [Dortmund Airport](#), you can take the AirportExpress to Dortmund Central Station in just over 20 minutes, and from there take the S-Bahn to the university. [Düsseldorf Airport](#), around 60 kilometers away, offers a wider range of international flight connections and can be reached directly by S-Bahn from the university station.

HOW TO GET FROM SEMINARRAUMGEBÄUDE I TO INNOCLUB (TECHNOLOGIEZENTRUM DORTMUND):

Address of Innoclub: TechnologieZentrum Dortmund, Emil-Figge-Str. 76-80, 44227 Dortmund, Innoclub Dortmund is located on the first floor

By **H-Bahn**: Line 1 runs every 10 minutes between Dortmund University S and the Technology Center. Alight at Technology Center (Technologiezentrum); the TechnologieZentrum Dortmund is located 100m ahead of the station.

On **foot**: Exit Seminarraumgebäude I and turn right, follow Friedrich-Wöhler-Weg to Otto-Hahn-Straße, turn right into Jopseh-von-Fraunhofer-Straße and follow the street to Emil-Figge-Straße. TechnologieZentrum Dortmund is located on the left hand side.

HOW TO GET FROM TU DORTMUND UNIVERSITY TO THE GERMAN FOOTBALL MUSEUM:

Address of the German Football Museum: Platz der Deutschen Einheit 1, 44137 Dortmund

By train: Take the S-Bahn line S1 from the “Dortmund Universität” station towards “Dortmund Hauptbahnhof”. Alight there; the German Football Museum is located directly opposite the main exit of the station.

By car: Drive on the B1/A40 towards Dortmund city centre and follow the signs to the main train station. The German Football Museum is located directly opposite the main station. Parking facilities are available in the surrounding parking garages.

HOW TO GET FROM TU DORTMUND UNIVERSITY TO DASA WORKING WORLD EXHIBITION:

Address of the DASA: Friedrich-Henkel-Weg 1-25, 44149 Dortmund

By public transport: Take the **S-Bahn line S1** from the “Dortmund Universität” station towards “Solingen/Düsseldorf” and alight at “Dortmund-Dorstfeld Süd/DASA”. From there, it’s approximately a 150-meter walk to DASA. Alternatively, you can take **bus line 447** (direction Huckarde) and get off at the “Bundesanstalt für Arbeitsschutz und Arbeitsmedizin” stop. DASA is located in the immediate vicinity of this stop.

By car: Drive on the A40 and take the Dortmund-Barop exit. Follow the signs to the “Bundesanstalt für Arbeitsschutz und Arbeitsmedizin”. Free parking spaces for cars and buses are available on-site.

On foot: The walk from Seminarraumgebäude I to DASA working world exhibition takes around 20 min. Exiting SRG I turn right and follow EUnet-Allee to Martin-Schmeißer Platz, descend the stairs to Vogelpothsweg, follow Vogelpothsweg approx.. 700m to city centre (see campus map), take a turn right to Friedrich-Henkel-Weg and follow the street for 100m to DASA. **You can join a walking group leaving from Seminarraumgebäude I at 17:45.**
